NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Pete Malinverni: A Beautiful Thing! (Saranac Records): Pianist Pete Malinverni's latest trio outing is both inspired and inspiring. Joined by bassist Lee Hudson and drummer Eliot Zigmund, Malinverni mixes bold repertoire choices — pop tunes by Bacharach and David and Billy Joel, a traditional spiritual, a French chanson — with his impeccably crafted originals. And his two-handed, two-minute solo excursion through Arlen's "My Shining Hour" is one breathtaking ride.

Ted Rosenthal: Impromptu (Playscape Recordings): "Jazzin' the classics" — sometimes it works wonderfully, sometimes it fails miserably. But it's never been achieved more successfully than on this engaging CD from pianist Ted Rosenthal (with Noriko Ueda on bass and Quincy Davis on drums). Rosenthal has transformed venerable themes by Bach, Brahms, Chopin, Mozart, and more into rich, new vehicles for creative jazz interpretation and improvisation.

Spanish Harlem Orchestra: Viva la Tradición (Concord Picante): Led by pianist Oscar Hernandez, the Spanish Harlem Orchestra is a medium-sized band with a huge sound. The SHO's spirited singers, electrifying percussionists, and distinguished horn section (trumpeters Hector Colón and John Walsh, trombonists Jimmy Bosch and Dan Reagan, saxophonist Mitch Frohman) honor the Latin jazz tradition and carry the idiom onward and upward.

Peggy Stern & "Sweet" Sue Terry: The Art of the Duo (Estrella Productions): There truly is an "art" to duo improvisation, an art that pianist Peggy Stern and alto saxophonist Sue Terry have mastered. Performing original works, a clever juxtaposition of "There Will Never Be Another You" and "Weaver of Dreams," and "Everything Happens to Me" (with Terry's new and witty lyric) these accomplished players converse with sensitivity, insight, and good humor.


