The results are in: The most overused — and least understood — words of 2017 are treason, fascism, and impeachment. Collusion soon will join the list, followed by the latest political buzzword, tribalism. (What is this? Rwanda? Just say "partisanship.") But by far the most misunderstood of these is impeachment.

Just Jazz

Article II, Section 4 of the Constitution expressly states, "The President, Vice President and all civil officers of the United States, shall be removed from office on impeachment for, and conviction of, treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors." So let's start here.

"And conviction of ..." means that impeachment alone is not enough It's an indictment, an accusation that someone — and, yes, we're talking about Trump — may have committed high crimes and/or misdemeanors, and that's all. So all those plaintive cries from liberals to "impeach Trump" should be amended, "impeach and convict Trump."

Of course to impeach you've got to have impeachable offenses. But do you? Well, someone called <u>Tom Stever</u> thinks so. In a ubiquitous TV ad this billionaire former hedge fund manager — and likely future California senatorial candidate — claims that Trump has brought the country to the brink of nuclear war, obstructed justice, taken money from foreign governments, and threatened to shut down some media organizations.

The trouble is that some of those things are not crimes at all, while the ones that could be crimes, so far, lack the evidence needed to back up this grandstanding self-promoter's charges. In time, Robert Mueller's investigators may produce the evidence needed to impeach and convict, and I think it's likely they will. But until then, you just don't have a case.

Add to that the simple fact that the House or Representatives is under tight Republican control. In practical terms this means that in he current political environment a bill of impeachment simply will not pass. And a premature attempt to impeach that fails would be a legal and a political disaster. Why? **Because you won't get a second shot at it.**

So I doubt Donald Trump will be impeached in 2018. But who knows? He may grow bored with the job, frustrated with his ineffectiveness, haunted by his incompetence, and just resign (while, of course, blaming someone else for it). And that's what I'm banking on. *Really.*

So here's wishin' you all a **Cool Yule** and a *Trump-free* **2018**, Bob


